


Weekly Market Report 11-24-17 Trent Milacek NW Area Ag Econ Specialist, OCES

News:



Continuing the analysis of feeder cattle futures from last week, prices have reacted as expected. The end of the orange line near \$150 shows the close at the end of last week. Prices increased to \$153/cwt. after hitting support at \$150/cwt. Resistance at \$155/cwt. will make it difficult for prices to continue higher. If they do, prices will show decent strength and may continue the rally. However, if weakness develops, prices may move below the \$150/cwt. support level tested last week. Risk aversion will determine how producers react if price protection is not in place. Indicators suggest that this is a strong price given current fundamentals and the least risky decision would be to lock in prices now. Producers who are less averse to risk may consider riding the market to attempt to secure prices above \$155/cwt. Current prices are \$9/cwt. off the contract high and are \$3/cwt. above recent support. The decision is yours and it is not an easy one.
